### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK . . .

Dear Parishioners and Friends of the Catholic Parishes of Western Holt and Boyd Counties,

In the first reading this weekend (Mal 3:1-4) the prophet Malachi promises that someday the Lord will return to the temple with a messenger before him. In this weekend's gospel (Luke 2:22-40), the Lord does return to the temple. Simeon the temple priest grasps the importance of this visit, first by recognizing that it is indeed the Lord whom he sees. Simeon has been waiting for the arrival of a savior, promised by God that he would be alive to witness. God appears not in might or majesty, but in the innocence of an infant. Coming out of Advent we might take this radical presence for granted – perhaps we have been admiring the nativity scene at our parish or our home. Alternatively, we may expect God to appear in glory as "the Lord mighty in battle," as this weekend's psalm describes (Psalm 24:7,8,9,10), picturing a God who appears decisively to solve all of our problems. When Christ reveals himself to us, whether in word, in sacrament, or in the face of another human being, will we recognize him? Or will we miss him because we are expecting something else?

Upon recognizing Jesus, Simeon prophecies that "this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel," and that Mary herself will be pierced. Malachi warns, "Who will endure the day of his coming?" Clearly the appearance of God is not all fun and games. A prominent theme throughout the remainder of Luke's gospel is that the revelation of God prompts a choice. If we recognize the presence of God in Jesus Christ, do we choose to follow, or do we walk away? Will we "rise" with Christ, or will we "fall" into sin and despair? As Malachai describes with images of fire and lye, God desires to purify us. To cleanse us of all defects or blemish, so that we can "stand when he appears." God is wholly love, and ultimately nothing that is not love can stand in God's presence for very long — this truth is grounds of Catholic teaching on purgatory after death. Refinement can be painful. Who among us wants to give up attachments or vices or worldly possessions? And who can do it without much struggle and anguish? As Simeon prophecies, Mary will be pierced for standing by Jesus to the end. Will we, too, persevere in faith?

Importantly, standing with God is not something that God asks us to do by ourselves. In fact, God's very relationship with Israel, concretized in the temple and likewise with us today, is one of abiding presence. Mary and Joseph provide a model of what standing with God can look like. At the presentation, they humbly give what they have for the service of God trusting that God will do the rest. As Luke notes, they provide two doves as an offering for the purification ritual, given that they could not afford a lamb (see Lev 12:6). In presenting Jesus in the temple, Mary and Joseph offer back to God the very extraordinary gift that they have been given, acknowledging in this gift that neither of them is Savior of the world – their son is. If we trust in God's Providence for each of us, then God will provide the grace to mold our hearts in his image.
